The baccalaureate degree program in nursing (RN-to-BSN and ABSN) at Goodwin University is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), 655 K Street, NW, Suite 750, Washington, DC 20001, 202-887-6791.

Students must have earned a bachelor of science in non-nursing major or bachelor of arts degree at a regionally-accredited college or university. Admission to the program requires a minimum 3.0 GPA in the most recently acquired degree or the last 12 or more credits earned at Goodwin University, and acceptance is determined via a point system. The point system considers the number of courses taken at Goodwin University, the student's GPA from the last 12 credits from their most recent degree, and points for their score on a pre-admission exam. All requirements must be completed before applying to the program.
